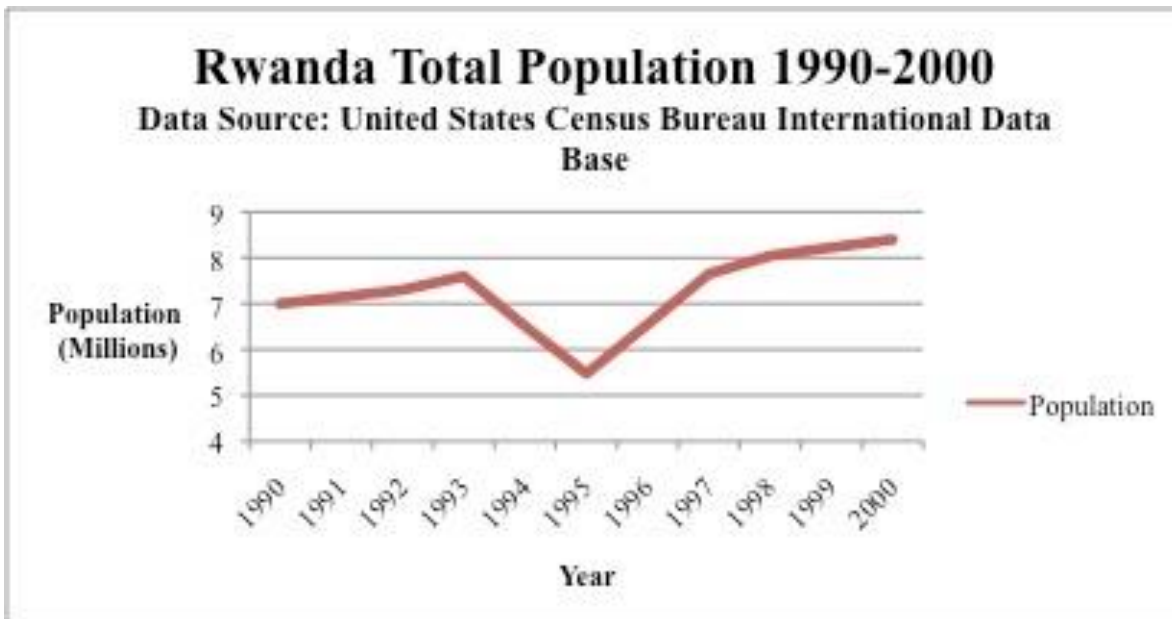

About 2,000 years ago, people who spoke Bantu languages migrated out of West Africa. They moved to Central Africa as well as Eastern and Southern Africa. The Bantu speakers mixed with peoples who already lived in these lands.

The migration of Bantu speakers had important effects of African life. They brought new ways for growing food. They used tools made of iron, which others also began to use. The Bantu speakers also brought their languages. Today, many Central Africans speak one or more of the some 500 Bantu languages, such as Rundi, Bemba, or Luba.
